


Update from Mike & Andrea

Dear Heart and Soul Family,

As you may know, our time in Argentina is coming to a close. We are in the final stretch of our initial 2 year commitment. If you did not read our blog, a quick update for our future plans: We are finishing up with OM Argentina, coming to the US for some months, and then switching over to Free Methodist World Missions and going to Uruguay. That is only a nutshell, as we would love to sit down with you and talk more about what God has done with us in these 2 years and what we believe is in store for our near future. We are writing to give you some more details about our time in the US, or at least as much as we have 'nailed down', and to give you advance notice that we want to meet with each of you, fellowship, catch up, and talk about your continued support. We know a lot has changed over 2 years and more than anything we want to see what God has done with and through you while we were away.

So here goes the tentative schedule for our time in the US: We plan on arriving mid-March to Michigan. We are planning on staying with Mike's parents in Grand Rapids, and West Michigan will be our base of operations while we are there. We will stay there for about a month until mid-April, so our hope is to meet with our supporters in Michigan in that month. After that, we will head to Rochester until roughly the end of July. We will likely be staying at Andrea's parents in Victor, so the east side of Rochester will be our base of operations in New York. July is when things get interesting and complicated. July will be fairly hectic for us, as we



are expecting a little Green to be added to the mix in the first week of July and Andrea's brother is getting married in the middle of July.

Our plan is to meet individually with our partners in NY during May and June. Shortly after the wedding, we will head back to Michigan so Mike's parents can enjoy their first grandchild. We will stay

there until the middle of December, squeezing in any final Michigan meetings and allowing Mike to continue the tradition of watching a Star Wars movie on the big screen with his dad/family. After Star Wars has been released, we will head back to Rochester for Christmas and stay there until we leave for Uruguay in January of 2016. We plan to make a southern state tour again, with stops in Pennsylvania, Virginia, North Carolina, and possibly South Carolina. The dates of that are yet to be decided, but probably it's looking like October time frame.

So that was our rough time frame for time in the US. As I stated we wanted to meet with each and every one of you. Our time will mostly be occupied by that, but we have a few other things on the radar for our time there. We plan on doing some training with the FM church and Andrea also wants to do some training with her mom and business partner for social entrepreneurship. Also during the summer months Mike will try to find a temporary job hopefully doing landscaping, so we can pay for some expenses and not be on 100% support the whole time there. Because we'll be meeting and traveling frequently, we need to be able to find part time jobs that allow for some flexibility in working hours. After the baby, Andrea will likely try to substitute teach in Grand Rapids and Mike will become a stay at home dad. This is for the same reasons, to cover expenses and because of its flexibility.

So as you can see, we have a whirlwind of a year in front of us. We would appreciate your prayers in this year that we're calling our year of change. We can't thank you enough for the place you have in our lives and we hope that you will prayerfully consider staying on our team as we go forward. Keep your eyes open for messages about solidifying meeting times, or just hangout times, and we'll be in contact soon.

Tax Season at H&S

In the spirit of being financially responsible, Heart & Soul has welcomed the non-profit Empire Justice's C.A.S.H. (Creating Assets Savings and Hope) program to offer free tax preparations for low income families.

C.A.S.H. is a free tax preparation service available to those who live in Monroe County. It has returned countless Earned Income Credits to households that fall under the programs requirements at no cost.

Clients have to make less than \$40,000 AGI (or less than \$55,000 AGI if they have dependents) to qualify for the program.
